Key Information Document



Purpose

This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products. This document sets out the generic risks of the PRIIP that you may be considering as a financial investment, in order that you can compare to other products. The specific terms of the product that you enter into will set out in the confirmation in relation to that product.

Alert: You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

What is this product?

Type OTC – Constant Maturity Swap

Objectives

The objective of this product is to periodically exchange two floating rate indices from the start date until the end date. You can agree to either (i) receive a cash flow linked to a short tenor index in return for you making a payment linked to a long tenor index (CMS rate) for a fixed term or (ii) agree to receive a cash flow linked to a long tenor index (CMS rate) in return for you making a payment linked to a short tenor index for a fixed term.

The product achieves its objective by (1) Danske Bank agreeing the terms of the Constant Maturity Swap with you; (2) you agreeing to pay or receive the long tenor index to/from Danske Bank in exchange for the short tenor index. Payments are determined on the basis of the notional amount agreed on for each interest rate period and paid on pre-agreed dates.

The product is sensitive to changes in the yield curve's slope and curvature. If the yield curve is upward sloping, the payer of the CMS rate obtains a negativespread to the CMS rate. This spread reflects the expected steepness of the yield curve during the term of the product.

The following typically applies:

- A steepening of the yield curve benefits the receiver of the CMS rate.
- A flattening of the yield curve benefits the payer of the CMS rate.

The terms set out below are illustrative of the terms for a Constant Maturity Swap, but are not the exact terms you agree with Danske Bank. The exact terms are set out in each individual trade confirmation letter.

The illustrative terms are used for subsequent performance scenarios and calculation of costs.

The product terms provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) Danske Bank may adjust the product; and/or (2) Danske Bank or you may terminate the product early. The exceptional events in question are specified in the product terms and relate principally to the underlying interest rate, the product and conditions pertaining to you or Danske Bank. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from that received in the scenarios described above.


Intended retail investor

This product is intended for retail investors who consider current par swap rates to be unattractive, who prefer exposure to a long-term floating rate index or want to be positioned for a steeper or flatter yield curve.

Term

The term of the Constant Maturity Swap depends on the period for which you wish to exchange your interest payments with Danske Bank. The term is agreed on before you enter into the Constant Maturity Swap. The Constant Maturity Swap is a bilateral agreement that cannot be ordinarily terminated unilaterally neither by you nor by Danske Bank.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you. We have classified this product as 7 out of 7, which is the highest risk class. This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.
